## A Sauce of happiness

For Elizabeth Kabore, the new well in her village, funded by Transform Burkina supporters, is making a huge difference to her life, every day.

Elizabeth lives in Ramogo, a remote rural community in Burkina
Faso. Before the well was built the nearest water source was a three kilometre walk away. Now, however, her family can access plentiful, safe water for washing and drinking close to their house. The water from the well also helps Elizabeth in the small business she runs to help supplement her income from farming; making delicious sauces and relishes for sale in the local market.

In the weeks before the rains come, Burkina Faso regularly sees day time temperatures in excess of 40C.

## When you need to go...

Alongside the provision of clean water for communities, we are also supporting a programme to provide latrines and information about improved hygiene and sanitation.

Very few houses or schools in rural Burkina Faso have toilets and this can lead to serious health risks. To give an idea of the scale of the problem it is estimated that 20% of all children suffer from preventable illnesses associated with poor hygiene practices and inadequate sanitation facilities.
