The clinic offers maternity, ante and post-natal care and a range of other medical services to a community of over 120,000 people in Zongo, one of the informal settlements on the edge of the capital, Ouagadougou.

A major expansion of one of the rural schools we support, at Soulyale, is pressing ahead to accommodate rising pupil numbers.

The pictured teachers house is already occupied, with a second house, a new classroom and toilets for the pupils all scheduled for completion in the coming months.
